10 candidates file for PERA board seats

Ten individuals have filed their candidacy for the five elected positions on PERA's Board of Trustees. All PERA active members and benefit recipients will have the opportunity to vote for the candidates of their choice during the month of January, with the winners announced the following month.

Filing for the three seats representing General Fund and Correctional Fund active members are Paul Bourgeois, John Carlson, Thomas Rupp, Clinton Schumacher, Thomas Stanley and Lori Volz. In the retiree/annuitant race are Ross Arneson, Marion Conwell and Gene

VanOverbeke, while David Metusalem is the lone candidate for the Police and Fire seat.

Voting – is a privilege, obligation, responsibility, and duty in our society. The fact that we contribute to our pension is sadly never included. Clearly, we need to remain vigilant and be strategically prepared to counter these attacks. If elected, I will make it my mission to be a strong advocate for protecting the pension we were promised.

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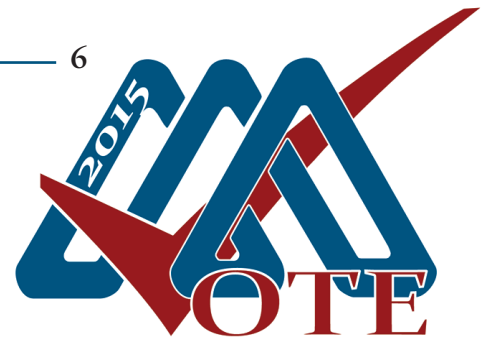
